Accommodation and meals are your choice and responsibility. At the venue of the summer school – a palace of Dundagas and hostel it is possible to get accommodation for a price of EUR 2-20 / per night (a mattress in a big room 1 LVL = ~EUR 2; a bed in a room of 4 – LVL 4 = ~EUR 6/ per night), a place for the tent – for free! **Payment for accommodation and meals in local lats, when you arrive.** *Please note that the amount of the places in palace are limited.*

  Meals are offered in the guesthouse „Krūziņi”: 3x/ a day: (Ls 5 = ~EUR 8) or just lunch. If you have your accommodation in the palace, there are 2 kitchens available, so there is a possibility for cooking (breakfast and dinner), if you take the responsibility for buying the ingredients and take time for it. WORKSHOPS OF THE SUMMER SCHOOL:



PhD CARYL SIBBETT (UK/Northern Ireland)

PhD Caryl Sibbett is an Art Psychotherapist and lecturer in the Centre for Psychotherapy, Belfast Health and Social Care Trust, where she is programme leader of the MSc Art Psychotherapy. She is also a lecturer in the School of Education, Queen's University Belfast, where she initiated and led the MSc Art Therapy and currently teaches at doctoral level on Arts-Based Research Approaches and researches into emotional health and wellbeing.

METAPHORS: MIRRORS AND REFLECTIONS

This Workshop will offer opportunities to explore the metaphors of 'reflection' and 'mirror' and their relevance to art therapy. This will also explore a connecting theme of the metaphor of 'light',

'Mirror' can be a metaphor for seeing ourselves reflected in relationships.

'Reflections' can relate to mirrors and light, and also be a metaphor for reflection on ourselves and on our practice.

'Light' can be a metaphor for being: visible, enlightened, illuminated, radiant, reflecting. It can also be a metaphor for feeling: playful, unburdened, not heavy; he sun. We will also explore Light in relation to colour and symbols such as rainbows. 'Mirrors of light' can also include symbols such as the Moon, water and crystals/jewels.

"Art as therapy is a mirror" that the individual makes to find his/her "own self reflected" (Simon, 1992).

HEALING SPACES

This Workshop will offer opportunities for exploring the importance of healing spaces – inner and outer spaces – in our life and work and in helping us to foster and maintain wellbeing. This may include exploring the significance of caring, creativity and good relationships with ourselves, with aspects of ourselves, with others, and with nature. Through creative art-making and play we may consider aspects relevant to healing spaces and wellbeing such as: our senses, nature / the environment, architecture, mazes/labyrinths, therapy rooms, balance, peace...

DISCOVERING THE INNER HERO

In this course participants will be introduced to some fundamental principles of Dramatherapy through a creative process using a variety of Dramatherapy methods.

The course will be theoretical and experiential journey.

There will be an exploration of the power of stories culminating in the "Discovery of the Inner Hero" demonstrating the therapeutic potentials of Dramatherapy.

DIALOGUES WITH THE SELF: IMPROVED SELF-AWARENESS THROUGH MUSIC AND CREATIVE EXPRESSIONS

Several music therapy techniques will be used to explore the participants' inner world through music and other creative expressive tools; the participants will have opportunities to discover their hidden sides, to find use for their inner resources that have not been used since now. Working in a group gives a possibility for reflecting each others experiences and getting new viewpoints towards themselves.

The training gives several skills of using music and creative activities in self-regulation, e.g. in stress management. In addition a session of the most popular receptive music therapy method the Bonny Method of Guided Imagery and Music (BMGIM) will be demonstrated and the Structural Model of Music Analysis (SMMA). Metaphor will be considered as an important tool of understanding the dynamics of the therapy process.

The atmosphere of the work-shop will be informal, free and playful. Stress releasing, inspiring and energy giving effect of music and creative expression will be experienced.

Methods: Guided and unguided music trips, creative problem solving, improvisation, musical interaction; group and pair discussions and feedback, self-analysis, demonstrations.



SUE CURTIS (UK)

Senior registered Dance Movement Psychotherapist specialising in working with children and young people, with emotional, physical and learning difficulties, in mainstream and special schools. Her work with children and young people has spanned more than 34 years and she has published about her work in mainstream schools. Her particular interests are in therapy with children who are in foster care, children who have suffered trauma and abuse as well as children with sensory impairment and complex needs. She is also now Programme Convener for the MA in Dance Movement Psychotherapy at Goldsmiths.

FINDING MY BODY-FINDING ME

The introductory workshop offers a broad introduction to the theory and practice of Dance Movement Psychotherapy. It is suitable for people who have some experience in fields relevant to Dance Movement therapy – such as social workers, occupational therapists, nurses, doctors and teachers – as well as those without such experience who want to learn about the field. There are experiential workshops that enable you to gain some understanding of the process of Dance Movement therapy, with lectures and presentations on specific aspects of the model. During the two days you will engage in discussion, role-play, creative expression and also a group experiential DMP session. No experience of dance practice is required – just a commitment to learn through movement and play, alongside others. You are advised to wear suitable clothing for moving in.

LOST AND FOUND. FINDING MEANINGFUL RELATIONSHIPS IN WORK WITH CHILDREN WITH SEVERE AND COMPLEX SPECIAL NEEDS

for DMT students/graduates

These main things which will be covered:

- what is our understanding and attitude towards children with learning difficulties
- the link between emotional growth and learning – how is this affected by specific learning difficulties
- feeling de-skilled or at a loss
- deepening relationships through use of non-verbal mediums
- thinking about counter-transference and bodily responses in the therapist



SABINE KOCH (Germany/USA)

PhD Sabine C. Koch, Psychologist, Dance/Movement Therapist, M.A., BC-DMT, is researcher and lecturer at the University of Heidelberg, Germany. Specialist in Kestenberg Movement Profiling, she teaches dance/movement therapy world wide. National Research Project on “Language of Movement and Dance”. Research interests include personality and social psychology, nonverbal communication, gender, health psychology phenomenology, movement analysis, and creative arts therapies.

Advanced Movement Studies – Kestenberg Movement Profile II

lecturer Sabine Koch, Germany/USA

for DMT students/graduates. (Please note that it is the 2. level)

In the Kestenberg Movement Profiling-II class we will treat the four remaining profiles: *pre-efforts* and *effort*, *shaping in directions* and *shaping in planes*. With these four perspectives will inspect the movement-meaning relations on the preconscious or the conscious level.

- **Pre-efforts** are related to learning styles and defence mechanisms of a person and are thus very important elements of clinical movement therapy.
- **Efforts** indicate qualities of movement that help the person in coping with the environment.
- **Shaping in directions** is relating to defending in relations and provide structure for learning.
- **Shaping in planes** refers to mature relations to others. Finally, we will apply our new knowledge to clinical cases and learn how to interpret an entire profile of parent child interaction.
